A Government-to-Government (or G2G) agreement creates **a legally binding agreement that disburses funds from USAID directly to a partner government to achieve mutual development objectives** in a given sector. USAID G2G funds go through the partner government's own procurement and financial management systems.

USAID's Accelerating Support to Advanced Local Partners II project can assist in the development, implementation, and monitoring of G2G agreements, providing capacity-building support throughout the process.

Support can be fully customized, to include:

The ASAP II consortium is led by IntraHealth International as prime partner, with major subcontractors including Deloitte Consulting LLP (Deloitte) and DAI for government-to-government support, Right to Care (RTC) for strategic information support, SustainAbility Solutions for assessments and training in USG rules and regulations, and Foundation for Professional Development (FPD) for accredited training and peer-to-peer learning opportunities.

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
