



For over a decade, IntraHealth International has collaborated with Senegal's government, health workers, and local stakeholders to strengthen the country's health system and bring high-quality health services to more communities. Years of investment have helped Senegal greatly reduce child mortality and malaria-related deaths, increase access to family planning (FP), and stabilize a low incidence of HIV.

Integrated Client Centered RMNCAH/N Care in West Africa (INSPIRE) (2017–2020)

Funder: Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation

- Integrates postpartum family planning; maternal, newborn, and child health; and nutrition services into a **package of services** delivered during the same client visit in nine Ouagadougou Partnership (OP) countries (Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Guinea, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Senegal, and Togo).
- Establishes integration of technical working groups (TWGs) to implement the integrated service model in the nine OP countries with representatives from Ministry of Health offices, professional associations, civil society, UNFPA, WHO, UNICEF, and other implementing partners.
- Supports a regional integration community of practice, led by WAHO, to provide technical assistance for scaling up integrated service delivery in all nine OP countries.
- Increased immediate post-partum FP by 97% using INSPIRE's integrated model of care.

USAID Global Health Supply Chain Francophone Task Order (2017–2022)

Funder: US Agency for International Development (USAID)

- Strengthens country management of health commodities.
- Provides technical assistance to ensure the long-term availability of health commodities in public and private services.

Better Hearts Better Cities–Dakar (2017–2021)

Funder: Novartis Foundation

- **Improves cardiovascular health outcomes** in four districts in Dakar by addressing hypertension from primary prevention at the community level to treatment at referral health centers.
- Increased links to treatment from 71% to 86% for cases diagnosed; improved the number of clients on treatment who have hypertension under control from 5% to 30%; and decreased the net systolic change among hypertensive patients by an average of 15.51 mmHg in 12 months.

ISD-HB/Neema (2016–2021)

Funder: USAID

- Expands access to and use of high-quality health services and products, including modern contraception, in communities and public-sector facilities.
- Provides HIV testing, linkages to antiretroviral treatment, and **high-quality differentiated care models** to key populations in targeted areas.
- Contributed to increases in newborns receiving essential care immediately after birth (51% to 75%) and exclusive breastfeeding (42% to 77%) between 2017 and 2019.
- Ensures that 57 service delivery points meet seven key services of basic emergency obstetric and neonatal care.
- Supports 3,576 communities organize emergency transportation, which has been used by 576 beneficiaries (including 435 females).
- Introduces providers to reproductive maternal newborn child adolescent health (RMNCAH) policies, standards, and procedures. To date, 1,089 providers (747 women) have been introduced to the policies, which are now available in 415 service delivery points.

The Challenge Initiative (2016–2021)

Funder: Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation

- Tests a comprehensive approach to improve contraceptive access for the urban poor, as developed under ISSU.
- Serves as a catalyst, advocate, and source for technical expertise to scale up FP in francophone West Africa, including in the OP countries.
- Works with self-selected cities to implement cost-effective, customized family planning interventions.
- Advocates for renewed and sustained investment in FP from cities and municipalities. Local governments in Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Niger, and Senegal have increased FP funding allocations by 25% and have spent USD \$150,000+ of domestic resources to implement project-supported FP projects.
- Trained 2,300+ providers across five countries to offer **universal FP referral**. This approach has been rolled out across eight health districts and 136 health facilities.
- Offers post-partum family planning in Ziguinchor, Senegal, resulting in over 25% of women accepting an FP method following delivery in a 3-month period.
- In 2019, the volume of FP clients across the 11 TCI-supported cities increased by 8%.

Ouagadougou Partnership Coordination Unit (2012–2021)

Funders: William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation

- Supports nine OP countries to reach over **2.2 million additional new users** of modern contraceptives.
- Advocates for and coordinates technical and financial assistance to develop, revise, and implement country FP costed action plans, and collects and disseminates data to measure progress.
- Facilitates information exchanges between countries, donors, and other actors, and convenes core donors and partnership members annually.

Strengthening Civil Society Engagement for Family Planning (2011 – 2021)

Funders: William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, Dutch Embassy

- Supports national civil society coalitions in the nine OP countries to develop and implement their own advocacy priorities.
- Identifies and organizes youth leaders into national and regional youth ambassador networks in the nine OP countries, including **training 500+ youth ambassadors** in advocacy, interpersonal communication, ICT, social media, and resource mobilization.
- Trains religious and traditional leaders in FP and social media to break taboos around FP use. Training for 300+ leaders so far has led to the creation the West African Religious Leaders Alliance for the Promotion of Health and Development.

Evidence to Action: Ebola (2014–2018)

Funder: USAID

- Trained 300+ peer educators to educate local communities about safe burial practices.
- Carried out 1,500 home visits by community relays.
- Held 150 community dialogue sessions with imams and mortuary workers on safe burial practices.

Informed Push Model/Yeksi Naa (2013–2018)

Funders: Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, Merck for Mothers

- Trained 2,900+ health workers in pharmaceutical stock management and pharmacovigilance to manage adverse reactions and side effects.
- Leveraged third-party operators to implement an **electronic Logistics Management and Information System (eLMIS)** to effectively track and forecast product consumption and health trends.
- Integrated 114 essential health products in the IPM/Yeksi Naa system, including contraceptives.

Hewlett-FP/Behavioral Economics (2014–2017)

Funder: The William and Flora Hewlett Foundation

- Used behavioral diagnoses to design interventions that increased the uptake of contraceptive use among women of reproductive age in two regions.

Strengthening and Expansion of Interventions for the Consolidated Control of the Pre-Eradication of Malaria (2012–2017)

Funder: The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB and Malaria

- Distributed 8,144,610 long-lasting insecticide treated bed nets in 2016.
- Community health workers visited 1.6 million homes to educate on the proper use of bed nets.
- Raised the national coverage of insecticide-treated mosquito nets to 91%, up from 8% in 2015.
